# Minutes of the 51<sup>st</sup> Annual General Meeting

## 8<sup>th</sup> October 2014, Directory of Social Change, London

## 1. Welcome & Apologies

Apologies were received from Council members: Derek Attwood, Siobhan O'Riordan and Charlotte Jeavons.

There was unanimous agreement that assets from the old company should be transferred to the new charitable company.

The meeting then became the first Annual General Meeting of the charitable company.

### 2. Presidency

John Lloyd handed over the presidency to Mark Forshaw.

#### 5. Council Report Received

Achieving charitable status is hoped to open doors financially and to help attract new members.

Three people were acknowledged for their hard work and contribution during their time with IHPE: Kathy Lewis, Helen Draper and Pat Davies. Dawn Wills was welcomed as the new administrator.

The jewel in the IHPE crown is the International Journal. This is thanks to the efforts and collaboration of Siobhan O'Riordan, Stephen Palmer and Routledge.

The content and presentation of the President's letter was complimented and the size of the journal discussed.

The newsletter is of an extremely high standard, thanks to the hard work of Sylvia Tilford with the support of Michael Watson.



Membership levels and finance are concerning. Corporate memberships are a potential target for future promotional activity.

Acceptance of the report was proposed (C Hart), seconded (S Cheater) and approved.

#### 6. Financial Report Received

Sylvia acknowledged the support of Helen Draper and Pat Davies with financial activities during the past year. Three areas have influenced the current financial position:

- Administration costs will rise as the mandatory tasks involved have changed
- Legal Support costs will be exceptionally high to the change to the charitable company
- Membership numbers continue to fall although there is potential to grow the number of members and therefore income

As well as a membership drive, the coming year will also see a review of subscriptions.

Acceptance of the report was proposed (B Qureshi), seconded (A de Barton-Watson) and approved.

## 7. IJHPE Report Received

The special edition received very positive feedback and it is hoped that the journal will soon achieve an impact rating.

Thanks was given to all those who have reviewed papers, especially as there has been an increase in the number of submissions. The standard of papers has improved and is very good.

The binding error experienced with one edition affected just a small number of copies and Routledge has given assurance that this mistake will not be repeated.

Michael is leading on the BMJ rapid responses to articles.

Acceptance of the report was proposed (M Watson), seconded (S Cheater) and approved.

#### 8. Resolution 1 – Appointment of Independent Examiners of the Accounts

It was unanimously agreed that Milner Boardman Ltd, Chartered Accountants, would continue in this role for the coming year.

The resolution was proposed, seconded and approved.
